Remarks: In April 1989 an Early Bronze Age bronze dagger, of a type dating to c. 1400 BC, and part of a human jawbone, were taken to Havant Museum by a metal detector user who had found them on Racton Park Farm at SU 77780 08681. Excavations were carried out around the findspot by Chichester District Archaeological Unit in May and June 1989. The site proved to be part of an almost intact crouched inhumation burial of Early Bronze Age 'Wessex' type. The burial lay directly on top of an ancient soil containing Neolithic flint tools including a barbed arrowhead and was apparently covered by a very shallow mound of chalk. Close to the skull, though disturbed, were found more than 20 small bronze rivets which had probably studded the handle of the dagger. {1} All finds deposited in Chichester District Museum. {2}

Using maps back to 1640, Rudkin suggests that the main rectangular feature may have been deliberately cut on the course of the Ems between 1724 and 1728. The soil map of this area and a surface trace of a ?watercourse? paralleling Foxbury Lane suggest that at one time the river ran down along New Road (previously Water Lane) which would explain the existence of the watercress beds, just past New Road, which, according to the owner (c.1984), had no known springs feeding them. The river may have been diverted prior to 1640 either to provide additional water supply to Westbourne Mill or to alleviate flooding in the village. {1}
